Happy New Year to you all.

Who would have thought that we would have been starting the year with another lockdown. As predicted back in May 2020 the new normal is face masks, hand washing and 2 metre distance.

We are back operating after our Christmas break with most of our co-workers back but unfortunately no volunteers at the moment due to Covid-19.

It has been a while since our last newsletter so we have tried to give you news from last year as well.

Although there is still snow on the ground we are already planning the garden for this year's growing of veg, fruit and flowers.

### **MAY/JUNE 2021**

2020's Open Weekend which was due to take place on the 23rd and 24th May 2020 did not go ahead but we did have lots of orders for veg plants and bedding plants which were delivered locally.

Gradually over these months we managed to start taking some of the co-workers back and also towards the end of June some of our volunteers as well.



### **JULY 2020**

July saw us starting up our veg bags from the gardens. We had about 40 bags each week and these were delivered to each customer's door rather than drop off points this year. This was a little more time consuming but was tied in with delivering some of our co-workers home on a Thursday afternoon and also on a Friday just after lunch. This is something the whole team can get involved in, whether it is boxing up eggs, weighing out veg, placing the veg into a bag or even helping with the delivery of the bags.



## **AUGUST 2020**

We also had lots of orders for flower bouquets or little posies of sweet peas. These flowers were delivered locally to individuals or also sold to some of the local florists or businesses.



We also bought another vehicle (a Peugeot Horizon) in August - this was bought to assist us with social distancing while transporting between gardens.



## **SEPTEMBER 2020**

During September we had a Royal Visit - Her Royal Highness - The Duchess of Rothesay. This Royal visit was made with all social distancing measures in place. Belinda gave her a tour of the garden which lasted about 30 minutes. Whilst the whole team was working in the garden throughout her visit, Her Royal Highness met Tom and his Dad. Her Royal Highness was presented with a bunch of dahlias which Tom had picked from the garden.



## **OCTOBER 2020**

October is a good month for the whole team to get involved in the picking of apples. The apples are then chopped, grated and put in the apple press for apple juice. The apple juice is then pasteurised and sold at various markets or direct to local customers. There are still some bottles left if you are interested in purchasing any.
